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Note #1: All Food Vendors are required to abide by the Rules and Regulations set forth by the Department of Public Health and Social Services and Guam Fire Department and pay for any and all fees incident to obtaining a license to operate your concession.

Note #2: Vendors who bid for more than one(1) food item and are successful in each bid may combine their concessions into one (1) booth.

Note #3: Existing franchises that wish to participate in this year's carnival and wish to operate the same food/restaurant businesses must pay an additional fee of \$2000.00 exclusive of the bid amount submitted and all other fees assessed. This fee is not part of the bid amount but will be assessed upon the awarding of a successful bid. A franchise can only sell items in a category bid for.

Note #4: All Food Booths are a maximum of 20ft. by 20ft. Please check with Ms . Malou Bumagat, Division of Environmental Health, DPHSS, at 735-7222 for booth requirements to meet Public Health and sanitation requirements. A meeting of all food vendors will be scheduled with Environmental Health Division representatives prior to the construction of booths (date and time TBA). All fees associated with other permitting agencies are the sole responsibility of the vendor. Food Vendors must provide their own tables, canopies and chairs for the use of their customers.

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## 2013 LIBERATION FESTIVITIES GUAM ISLAND FAIR BIDDING RULES & REGULATIONS

The following Rules and Regulations have been established for the 2013 Liberation Festivities Guam Island Fair Carnival bidding process. Failure on the part of prospective bidders to adhere to these Rules & Regulations will result in the disqualification of their bid(s).

1. Each bid packet will contain one (1) Bid Form. Please be advised that only one (1) bid may be submitted on each form. If you wish to bid for more than one (1) concession you will have to make copies of the bid form for each bid you want to submit. "Package Bidding" will not be allowed or accepted.
2. Each submitted bid must include, at a minimum, an equivalent of twenty-five percent (25%) security deposit of the bid price. Personal checks will not be accepted. Only cash, cashier's check, certified checks, or money orders will be acceptable. The payee is: 2013 Guam Island Fair. **Non-winning bid security deposit(s) will be returned or applied to other winning bids from the same bidder.**
3. Bids must be sealed in any envelope and will be accepted anytime, during normal working hours, Monday to Friday, 8a.m. to 5p.m., **BUT NO LATER THAN 6:00p.m.** on Monday, March 18, 2013 at the Mayors' Council of Guam Office, Suite 111F, J & G Commercial Building, Hagatna.
4. **Opening of bids will begin on Monday, March 18, 2013, at 6:01p.m., at the Mayors' Council of Guam Office.**
5. Successful bidders with qualified bids will be notified by telephone commencing March 20, 2013 but no later than 5:00p.m., March 21, 2013.
6. Bids for alcohol/beer sales, Casino and/or Games of Chance must have an attached "Authorization Form" from a duly registered, and in good standing non-profit organization. Also attached MUST be a "Clearance or a Letter of Good standing status" for such Non-Profit organization issued by the Department of Revenue and Taxation within 15 days prior to the date of bid submission. Additional Rules & Regulations and requirements for Alcohol/Beer, Casino and/or Games of Chance and Food Concessions are attached and must be complied with and agreed to before a final Concession award is made.
7. Bids for a Game of Skill should include a game description and any other information necessary to assist the committee to ensure that it is not a (any) variation of a game of chance. Games of Skill will not be limited and duplication of games will be allowed, provided however that a bidder for a Game of Skill who offers a higher bid fee for the same type of game will have first option to choose his/her site where Games of Skill

have been pre-determined to be placed. The Committee will assist all vendors who have multiple concessions in the placement of their concessions in a single location provided they are within the same category.

8. Winning bid shall be awarded based on the highest bid price submitted and qualified for each category as determined during the opening of the bids and as further determined by any Rules & Regulations that must be adhered to by the successful bidder. All bids for Games of Skill are considered winning bids provided they meet the minimum 25% security deposit. Positioning and location on carnival grounds will however be based on bid amount with "one vendor-multiple concessions" to be considered. Locations of Concession categories on Carnival Grounds will be pre-determined by the Concessions Committee before actual location of vendors are made.
9. **All bid balances and Common Area fees for all Concession Booth(s) awarded are to be made on or before 6:00p.m., Friday, March 27, 2013. ONLY CASH, CASHIER'S CHECK, MONEY ORDERS, or BANK CERTIFIED CHECKS ACCEPTED.**
10. **In the event a bid has been awarded and the bidder is unable to submit payment in full, on or before the scheduled time for such concessions on March 27, 2013, then such bid shall be disqualified and security deposit forfeited. The offer shall then be made to the next highest bidder. If there is no other bidder, the concession shall then be sold at the bid price of the highest bid in that category.**
11. The 2013 Liberation Festivities Guam Island Fair Carnival Committee reserves the right to accept or refuse any and all bids.
12. Common Area Fees include common area clean-up, trash removal, common area toilets, and operation hours traffic and crowd control. All booths must provide their own electrical wiring capable of carrying their required loads and must clean on a daily basis within their concession space area and place collected debris in front of their booths for daily collection after carnival hours. No trash will be picked up or collected that is not placed in front of the booth in trash bags. It is the responsibility of the vendor to provide provisions for utility connections to their individual booths. Please see attached requirements for electrical light usage and preference and for mandated recyclable product usage.
13. In case of an unexpected disruption of the festivities due to "an act or acts of God", inclusive of inclement weather, power/water outages, or other man-made disasters, the 2013 Liberation Festivities Executive Committee, along with the Carnival Committee, will not be responsible for any loss of life, limb, revenue, property or damages sustained.
14. It is the sole responsibility of the concessionaire to provide for his/her **own security** of his/her booth(s) and property before, during, and after carnival operations.

15. Concessionaires can only operate their booths based on their category or bid items. Vendors are restricted to operations within their assigned space and cannot operate games or sell items not identified for that space. Any vendor that does not comply or knowingly violates the terms of the Carnival Committee or these rules will be immediately notified either orally or in writing, to discontinue the alleged violation or be terminated from operating for the remainder of the Carnival period and all payments made to the Committee automatically forfeited.
16. Utility Fees will be assessed per vendor based on approximate electrical usage and types of electrical equipment installed. Fees will be assessed on current Guam Power Authority fee schedules. All vendors must provide an equipment list and electrical usage requirements on or before May 1, 2013. All utility fees assessed must be paid on or before May 17, 2013. The 2013 Concessions Committee reserves the right to mandate any vendor to apply for their own utility and meter hookup for their own electrical services based on the electrical needs and approximate load consumption.
17. The Casino group of games (games operated within the Casino Building) will be allowed to operate based on an authorization and an approved schedule as approved by the Liberation Executive Committee and the Governor of Guam. A minimum of four (4) Security personnel shall be present to maintain customer control and security checks on said establishment at all times during operations. Absolutely NO MINORS will be allowed to enter or play in the Casino buildings. No games are permitted inside the Casino which conflicts with other Games of Chance awarded and permitted on the Carnival Grounds, EXCEPT for a Games of Chance concession(s) that is awarded and operated by the Casino concessionaire. Prior approval from the Liberation Executive Committee must be obtained. No Casino Games may be resold or re-bid to another entity without the expressed consent and approval of the Liberation Executive Committee. The Liberation Executive Committee reserves the right to assess additional fees and charges for other entities to operate any approved games within the Casino.

**NOTE: ALL MATTERS NOT DISCUSSED OR ADDRESSED BY THESE BIDDING RULES & REGULATIONS SHALL BE BROUGHT TO THE ATTENTION OF THE 2013 LIBERATION FESTIVITIES GUAM ISLAND FAIR EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE BY THE CONCESSIONS COMMITTEE FOR CONSIDERATION. THE DECISION(S) OF THE 2013 LIBERATION FESTIVITIES GUAM ISLAND FAIR EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE SHALL BE FINAL.**

**Local Arts & Crafts ( Registered as Guam Product Seal), Plants, Fruits, Vegetables and Ornamental Flowers will be made a part of the 2013 Liberation Festivities and only a minimal utility fee will be assessed provided, however, that the concessionaire provides their own 10ft. by 20 ft. canopy with no major electrical appliances or air-conditioning.**

## Imagine Guam: Zero Waste or Pretty Darn Near!

To All Vendors:

The Mayors' Council of Guam, in collaboration with the i\*recycle program, is proud to announce its goal of "Zero Waste or Pretty Darn Near" at all the Liberation-related events, and particularly the Liberation Carnival. What this actually means is that we will implement aggressive recycling of everything that can be recycled on Guam. This includes aluminum cans, steel cans, plastics 1 and 2, glass, cardboard, plastic six-pack rings, and waste cooking oil.

Any of these items that are generated within your booths should be given to the recycling team to be added to the bags of recyclables. There will be a large container for corrugated cardboard to be used by all vendors. Cereal box type cardboard can be recycled as well and should be separated out. It can now be recycled with mixed paper at Mr. Rubbishman. All of these items will be taken to the proper facilities for recycling by Peggy Denney, program administrator of the i\*recycle program, and her volunteers.

The recycling effort will also include separating out all food waste for use by pig farmers as has been done in the past. With the rise in shipping and fuel costs, food waste should be put to good use to reduce the need for importing pig feed. This will include any food waste that is generated within your booth and not served to customers that you would otherwise throw out. We encourage you to use dispensers for condiments, such as ketchup, mustard and mayonnaise, instead of the separate little packets which create more waste.

And finally, we will be implementing an aggressive program to promote the use of biodegradable food service products in order to eliminate Styrofoam and all non-recyclable plastic products. This will significantly decrease the overall volume of trash generated at the carnival. We will be requiring the use of biodegradable products, which include food products made from paper, corn, bamboo or bagasse. Food and Drink Vendors may be eligible for a REFUND (UP TO 50%) on their Common Area Fee if these products are used, and we are working with suppliers of these products to provide them at a discount.

These biodegradables will be separated from other trash and will be composted to ensure that they are not taken to the landfill. This not only reduces the volume of waste generated but also creates a product that can be used by Guam's farmers to improve soil quality.

Additionally, because we are striving to make this a truly "green" event, all vendors will be required to use CFLs, compact fluorescent light bulbs, rather than the traditional incandescent bulbs. CFLs require much less energy than incandescent and will reduce the power consumption at the carnival dramatically. The final determined amount to be charged for utilities will depend on the type of bulbs and load consumption used by the individual vendors.
