III. RECITATION OF INIFRESI

IV. SECRETARY'S REPORT - Minutes of April 4, 2018 – Mayor Robert Hofmann made the motion to approve the *Report* and seconded by Mayor Vicente Taitague. No further discussions or objections and the motion carried.

TREASURER'S REPORT – Mayor Robert Hofmann made the motion to approve the Report and seconded by Mayor Vicente Taitague. No further discussions or objections and the motion passed.

V. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT: Audience request by Elaine Eclavea approved by the Body during the Regular Monthly meeting in April. Because Ms. Eclavea was the only request for May, it was decided during the Executive Officers meeting last week to have Ms. Eclavea make her presentation before today's Regular Monthly meeting was called to order. The regularly scheduled Special Monthly meeting for May 16 had been cancelled.

2. Communications

- a. **KONFERENCIA MEETING** ED reported a teleconference made with Saipan and the Mayors' Council on Monday, April 30. Discussed was that last year when they got a quote from Cabras Marine it was \$30K, this year the quote was \$79K for the same trip from Saipan to Pagan. Because they cannot raise that kind of money in six week's time, they may decide to postpone the *Conference meeting* and work from now til next year in trying to raise the funds for the Pagan trip. When an official notice is received, ED would let Council members know.
- b. **REQUEST FOR ST. DYMPHNA DONATION** Guam Behavioral Health and Wellness Center would be celebrating their annual event and fiesta on May 18 and seek food and drinks donation from the Mayors' Council. Should mayors' want to donate, they can call Mr. Gary Famisaran at 488-5866.
- c. **TINIAN SAN JOSE FIESTA** Mayor Joey San Nicolas invited Council members to attend the celebration scheduled for May 4-6. ED said the mayor didn't put it in his letter but if members would like to assist in donating whatever they could to use for the fiesta; food products, paper products, soda, water, beer.
- d. **MCOG BUDGET HEARING** ED reported Council's hearing date is not yet on the calendar with the Office of Finance and Budget. ED would give notice to Council members once notified by the Speaker's office.
- e. **GEPA RECYCLING** ED reminded Council members to submit their weekly reports of recyclable materials so that Council could send the monthly report to GEPA as per the MOU. Some villages have already exhausted their *transport* purchase orders and ED cannot increase the purchase order until Council Admin office receives invoices to make sure that it had been exhausted and said to remind those vendors to submit invoices as soon as they

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could. The next purchase order mayors would be receiving are for tires and loose metals and after that would be the batteries. With tires, the hold up is that Council is waiting for

Guahan Recycling's acceptance of purchase orders; there are only two places that would take tires, Global and Guahan.

GDOE GRASS CUTTING – ED announced a meeting with the superintendent tomorrow at 1:30 p.m., May 3 at his office in Tiyan to try and work things out. He gave suggestion that Council representative to the Board, Mayor Rudy Matanane, to attend and mayors who have GMS.

CARNIVAL – ED said the last he heard from Oyaol Ngirairikl Communications Officer with the Office of the Governor is that they are still looking for the money and is only going to be for two weeks.
